Again this year history will come to life through a re-enactment of the 1804 pistol duel between Aaron Burr and Alexander Hamilton. Burr, first term Vice President of the United States under Thomas Jefferson, shot Hamilton, Secretary of the Treasury, in a duel fueled by years of animosity and personal tensions between the two political rivals. Learn what the significance of this duel between national leaders had on Clinton’s history and why once named Burrville changed its name to Clinton. The re-enactment is scheduled to take place 12:30pm in the “flat” on Market Street in front of the Hoskins/Lane Park.

Roane State has launched Middle College in Anderson County Schools for 19 stu-dents from Anderson County High School and 17 students from Clinton High School.
