Dream It. Do It. Kicks Off Its Fourth Season



he Anderson **County Chamber** of Commerce kicked off it's fourth season of Dream It. Do It. East Tennessee on October 19th at Oak Ridge Associated Universities (ORAU).

The program is a partnership with CNS Y-12, Anderson County Schools, Clinton City Schools, and Oak Ridge Schools focusing on middle school students showcasing Anderson County's Manufacturing Industires. With Cannon video cameras, provided by CNS Y-12, six teams of

eighth graders from Anderson County Schools and Oak Ridge Schools are paired with industries to create videos that tell the companies' stories. Sixth grade students from Clinton City Schools will also divide up into teams to create websites that represent each manufacturing company in Anderson County.

This year's teams are: Clinton Middle School and Protomet. Jefferson Middle School and Eagle Bend MAGMA, Lake City Middle School and AISIN Automotive Casting Tennessee; Norris Middle School and Clayton Homes, Norwood Middle School and SL Tennessee, as well as Robertsville Middle School and Techmer PM.





ACT Success Celebrated at High Schools

HS and ACHS have enjoyed celebrating ACT success this fall in a variety of ways that honor high achieving students. Both high schools held celebrations at football games to honor students with 30+ ACTs. students who met all ACT benchmarks who are honored as the Elite 100, and those who earn state designation as "Ready Graduates" by earning a score of 21 or better. Each level of ACT achievement qualifies a student for different prizes sponsored by GEAR UP and their high school. The goal of the tiered recognition to help students aspire to higher scores to earn greater honors and bigger scholarships. The

ACT is a four hour exam given twice to each graduating class during school and on Saturdays selected as national testing days. A student should take their first ACT when they complete Algebra 2 regardless of their grade level as the majority of the math tested is covered by the end of the Algebra 2 course. ACT tutoring is offered at each high school. For more information about tutoring contact the ACT Prep Coordinator at your high school. 3M Donates to Clinton City Schools

few years ago, Clinton welcomed a new 3M facility to the city. Since then, 3M has annually donated supplies to the schools including post-it notes, notepads, tape, markers, and a wide variety of other supplies. Plant manager, Jason Leslie, has become active in the community serving on the Chamber Board of Directors and

participating in community events.

Recently, 3M awarded approximately \$4,000 in STEM grants to CCS! Due to their generosity, Virtual Reality has made its way into our classrooms. We now have a set of VR machines for students to use allowing them to take virtual field trips, travel through the circulatory system, and dissect a variety of specimen. Third graders at North Clinton Elementary now have access to individual student coding and STEM kits called Little Bits. When walking into Mrs. Smythson's classroom, you will find students using creative and analytical skills to build and solve real-world problems. A grant was also funded which purchased materials and supplies for the STEM 1st and 2nd grade club called Blaze Project H20. Students are using water as the foundation for learning basic science concepts through experiments and exploration. During the first session, students analyzed specimen in the petri dish to learn about the importance of hydration.

ASAP of Anderson | Prevention Is: Support for Students

SAP of Anderson celebrated its 10th anniversary this past September. Over the past ten years ASAP has partnered with the Clinton City and Anderson County Schools to support students and encourage the prevention of substance misuse. During Red Ribbon Week on October 23rd to 31st, we are especially involved in raising awareness for substance misuse prevention throughout the schools. Students across all three Clinton City Schools will be participating in prevention activities.

The ASAP Ambassadors are high school students who share ASAP's mission to prevent and reduce substance misuse by youth and adults in Anderson County. These students coordinate efforts in their school, as well as the elementary and middle schools including campaigns to prevent underage tobacco and alcohol use. Each year the Ambassadors travel to Nashville to educate their lawmakers on the issues that matter to them and their fellow students, host events in the schools to increase knowledge such as National Alcohol and Drug Facts Week, and create a prom campaign aimed to prevent underage

drinking. The support of the school administration allows these students to promote campaigns throughout the schools, organize their efforts, and become leaders to make real changes in their schools and community.

Other partnership efforts include working with schools to review their policies to make needed changes to keep current with issues and trends. Ten years ago, electronic nicotine delivery systems (ENDS) devices and other A "vaping" products were non-existent in schools and policies needed to be updated. It is vitally important to keep up with these ever-changing trends. ASAP works to keep up with these trends and programs to track progress and ensure effectiveness.

ASAP's work cannot be completed without the help of all community partners. Prevention is support for students, and the Clinton City and Anderson County School systems are saying "I AM ONE who will be proactive against substance abuse" by putting students first and recognizing the importance of a healthy and safe students body.

FASFA Time in Tennessee

egardless of whether your team is winning or losing this football season, every high school senior can be a winner in FAFSA season. The FAFSA, formally called the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, is required of all students who intend to be enrolled in college in 2019-2020. The FAFSA determines a student's eligibility for Pell grant funds, helps colleges determine financial aid packages based on income, and awards students state need based funds as well as meet requirements for Hope Lottery Scholarships and TN Promise. Parents are required by the federal government to provide tax information on their student's FAFSA unless a student is in guardianship, has been in foster care after age 13, or the student

is emancipated. This requirement remains until a student is 24 years old even if they no longer live with a parent. Seniors in Anderson County Schools may get help with their FAFSAs at their high school. FAFSA help days are announced in students' acs email. Over 100 FAFSAs were completed in Anderson County on six designated GEAR UP FAFSA Frenzy Days in October. Colleges also offer FAFSA help. The website to complete a FAFSA is FAFSA.gov. The FAFSA must be completed by Feb 1 for a student to remain eligible for TN promise.




